PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

We have an exciting speaker for our annual dinner meeting. Supreme Court Justice Thomas Kilbride will speak on "Money in Judicial Races."

Are we going to allow our justice system to be politicized? It isn't only the Supreme Court races, but in 2011-12 with Citizens United in effect, Illinois ranked 2nd highest in funding of lower court races with \$8.9 million spent. Another reason we should participate in the LWVUS study of our position on money in politics this year.

Thanks to Mary Jane, Pat, the volunteers, our partners, and the candidates, we have had some wonderful candidate forums. And, we have a request for one more depending on what happens in the 18th Congressional District race.

We reached out to three new areas - Dunlap, Pekin, and Washington -continuing to work toward a regional emphasis.

On April 14 Pat and I are meeting with Pekin residents about forming a Pekin Unit of our League. The Pekin Unit would have meetings in Pekin to concentrate on issues of concern to their community as well as participating in LWVGP events. Some Leagues on the west coast have as many as 14 units of local interest.

*Dues increase proposal will be voted on by members at the Annual Business Meeting on May 7

From the By-Laws of the League of Women Voters of Greater Peoria, Illinois: Article VI, Section 2: "Dues will be set at least at the sum of the per member payment (PMP) to the state and national League of Women Voters. Dues for two members at one address and sharing a common household will be one and one-half single members dues." We have kept our dues at just enough to cover our national and state pmp cost. LWVUS is increasing their pmp for 2015-16 by \$1. Our local League does not get any money from our current dues structure and we will incur costs from accepting PayPal payments. As President, I suggest, and the Board agreed to forward to our members for vote that we increase dues \$1 so that LWVGP gets \$1 per member for our operating costs in 2015-16. That would raise our single to \$60 (was \$58 + \$1 increase for national + \$1 for LWVGP); \$90 for household(was \$87 + \$2 national increase + \$1 for LWVGP), and \$31 student (was \$29+\$1national increase + \$1 for LWVGP.) - Cheryl Budzinski
